NEWS FROM THE STATES

The members of IRAE were involved with a number of activities during the Illinois Art Education Association's 69th fall conference, held Nov. 30 – December 2, 2017. This was the first year that the conference was held in December, but the turnout was commendable considering the holiday season (over 500 attendees!) This was also the first year that the conference was held in a "Conference Center", which afforded access to a large number of meeting rooms as well as general meeting auditoriums. We also experienced a new approach to meals with refreshment areas (called "Nourishment Bars") instead of breakfasts and a broad range of lunch and dinner offerings in the dining halls that provided more options for attendees with special foods requirements. People were able to stay on-site in reasonably priced accommodations or attend the conference as non-residents.

In addition to serving as volunteers at the scholarship raffle table, registration area and other volunteer jobs, several IRAE members also presented sessions and a hands-on workshop during the conference. Coordinating a Friday morning workshop titled "Art Practice for Retirees", were IRAE co-chairs, Anne Becker and Kathryn Hillyer. They organized a free workshop as an opportunity for IRAE members and non-retirees to draw and paint the spectacular vistas on view from the Conference Center windows. The workshop wrapped up with an informal critique of the work created during the morning.

Following lunch on Friday, Kathi and Anne hosted a panel of IRAE members in a session titled "View From the Far Side: Retired Art Educators' Insights." Joining Kathi and Anne on the panel were IRAE members Karyl Silerzio and Becky Blaine. The panelists shared their insights and experiences from teaching at all levels and how they dealt with changes in the field of art education. Also discussed were their observations of how retirement has affected their lives and their continuing involvement with art education. The session ended with the panelists' recommendations for other retired teachers, for teachers who are planning to retire soon, and for younger teachers who wanted to hear about the panelists' experiences and observations.

Saturday morning, Kathi and Anne led a discussion of how IRAE members can become more involved with the IAEA organization and the state conference. Participants also discussed options for activities to encourage IRAE members to become connect and stay active outside the conference. Many of these ideas were then shared in the afternoon during the general conference-planning meeting. All IRAE members were encouraged to attend the NAEA convention next March in Seattle.


