NAEA DISTINGUISHED FELLOWS 1983-2021

DISTINGUISHED FELLOWS CRITERIA

Distinguished Fellows (DF) of the National Art Education Association are members of the NAEA who are recognized for their service to the Association and to the profession. Each Fellow demonstrates a reasonable profile of accomplishment that extends across several criteria:

- NAEA or other awards that honor exemplary teaching, research, scholarship, leadership, and/or professional service.
- Chair or member of NAEA standing and/or ad hoc committees
- National or regional convention program chairs
- NAEA task force membership or chair
- Editorship and/or member of editorial boards of NAEA publications
- Research and research-related activity reported through NAEA publications
- Major presentations at NAEA national or regional conventions (general sessions, super sessions, etc.)
- Board of Directors or Delegates Assembly or service on other NAEA governance bodies

Officers and Board members may be nominated as Fellows only after retirement from the Board of Directors. The immediate NAEA Past President is automatically nominated upon conclusion of his or her term of office.

HISTORY

In 1980, NAEA President Kent Anderson, and Past Presidents Charles Dorn and Harlan Hoffa initiated what was referred to as the Past Presidents Council of NAEA. In March of that year, at the NAEA Convention in Atlanta, five Past Presidents convened for a wine and cheese reception to discuss the possibility of forming such a group under the auspices of NAEA.

In March 1982, Harlan Hoffa and NAEA Executive Director John Mahlmann met and discussed forming an NAEA Distinguished Fellows group. Hoffa wrote to NAEA President Kent Anderson, then Past President of NAEA, "Many professional groups recognize members who have distinguished themselves in one way or another by designating them as Fellows. There is no vehicle for such recognition in art education, and the profession has been worthy of the continuing special recognition that designation as Fellow would afford."

The establishment of the Distinguished Fellows with duties and responsibilities, criteria, selection processes, and administration became official during the presidency of Edmund Feldman (1981-1983). The 16 NAEA past presidents made up the first class of Distinguished Fellows and the following year other NAEA members were considered for DF membership.

CURRENT INITIATIVES

Fellows Forums

Fellows Forums at the National Convention may only be proposed and presented by Distinguished Fellows. Procedures are as follows:

- Distinguished Fellows may respond to the National Convention Program Chair's call for presentations by preparing a proposal.
- When appropriate and necessary, the Distinguished Fellow who proposes a Fellows Forum session may invite other experts, who are not Distinguished Fellows, to join the proposed

- Forum presentation.
- Proposals should be titled "Fellows Forum: ___" with the content title for the session following the colon.
- All proposed Fellows Forums are reviewed with others submitted in the same area or category using the same procedures as all convention proposals. Acceptance is not guaranteed.

Ask a Fellow and Convention Mentoring Sessions

Ask a Fellow is a project of the NAEA Distinguished Fellows intended to bring together researchers who have questions with Distinguished Fellows who have answers and can offer sound advice on research topics and projects. Art educators submit questions about research or professional topics to the Distinguished Fellows through the NAEA website (www.arteducators.org). The question is then distributed to Distinguished Fellows for response. Since 2009, DF David Burton who initiated the project, has also acted as the facilitator. To provide support, he is currently organizing daily mentoring sessions at the NAEA National Convention.

NAEA Research Commission and Distinguished Fellows Liaisons

The NAEA Research Commission has developed a liaison structure with Commissioners assigned to represent NAEA divisions, regions, interest groups, or publications. The Commission provides an opportunity for NAEA leaders to discuss research matters; shared interests; and the procedures, policies, and initiatives developed by the Research Commission. Ways in which the Commission can foster the interests of the NAEA DF in research-related work are conveyed by the DF liaison to the Commission. The DF Liaison does not attend RC meetings but is informed of research activity pertinent to the Fellows interests and subsequently reports these activities back to the DF group.

LEADERSHIP RESPONSIBILITIES

Chair

- Presides at the annual business meeting and reception.
- Informs all Fellows of an agenda for the business meeting in advance of the NAEA National Convention.
- Communicates, when appropriate, with the NAEA Executive Director.
- Solicits from DF nominations of NAEA members as prospective Distinguished Fellows.
- Reports Distinguished Fellows election results to the NAEA Board.
- Notifies all new Fellows to offer them congratulations on being elected for membership.
- Inducts newly elected Distinguished Fellows at a Convention General Session.
- Coordinates DF initiatives and provides feedback requested by the NAEA Board of Directors.
- Organizes proposals for Fellows Forums to be presented at NAEA National Conventions.
- Informs Fellows about Fellows Forums to be presented at NAEA National Conventions.
- Writes occasional news items/columns about the Fellows for NAEA News.
- Monitors the selection of the Fellows Chair, Membership Chair, and Secretary.
- Supports the Fellows Membership Chair and NAEA staff in the election process by gathering and/or disseminating information as requested.

Membership Chair

- Maintains and updates the NAEA Distinguished Fellows contact list along with the Fellows database record of membership.
- Prepares and disseminates the annual call along with credentials required for nominations.
- Manages the annual nomination and election process for new Fellows in concert with NAEA staff.
- Reports election results to the Fellows Chair and NAEA Board.
- Introduces newly-elected Distinguished Fellows at the annual Fellows business meeting.
- Requests updated contact information yearly and distributes a revised list of contact information to all Fellows by January 15. A copy is also to be sent to the NAEA Office for their files.
- Supports the Fellows Chair by gathering and/or disseminating information as requested.

Secretary

- Distributes and collects a sign-in sheet at the annual Fellows business meeting and subsequently appends it to the meeting minutes.
- Takes minutes at the annual business meeting.
- Collects copies of all DF National Convention session proposals and recognitions of Fellows to append to the meeting minutes.
- Sends a rough draft of the minutes to the Fellows Chair and Membership Chair for review.
- Submits final minutes to the Fellows by May 1 following the annual business meeting.
- Corrects minutes, as needed, based upon Fellows' suggestions.

OFFICER NOMINATION AND ELECTION PROCESS AND TIMELINE

The DF Chair will conduct a leadership election for Chair, Membership Chair, and Secretary every 3 years. In off years, a leadership election, using the same procedures and timeline, may be held to fill a vacancy.

Every 3 years, after the completion of the fall membership election: The Chair will a solicit at least two nominees for each leadership position vacancy and review nominations with the DF Membership Chair and Secretary.

January 1: Nominations are due.

January 15: Deadline for distribution of the ballot. The DF Chair will work with NAEA staff to distribute DF leadership election ballots electronically to the Distinguished Fellows.

February 1: Deadline for voting. The DF Chair will notify NAEA Executive Director of the results of the election.

March 1: Election results are announced.

The new DF leadership team will take office at the end of the NAEA DF National Convention Business Meeting/Reception. The new Chair should publicly recognize the leadership and service of the retiring team.

DISTINGUISHED FELLOWS MEMBER NOMINATION AND ELECTION PROCESS AND TIMELINE

The NAEA Distinguished Fellows conduct an annual call for nominations and election of new members in the fall. The timeline is developed by planning backwards from the NAEA fall Board meeting. In 2021, the Board meeting is November 12-14, and the Board materials are distributed two weeks prior, October 28.

August 16 (specific date set annually): The DF nominations team made up of the Membership Chair and Chair distribute nominations packets, comprised of the following, to all DF members:

- Distinguished Fellows criteria
- Consent to serve/nomination form
- NAEA standardized vita form
- Request for nomination letter < 350 words

It is customary for all nominees to receive a second opportunity to be elected by the Fellows. During the nomination process, any previous year nominees who did not meet the 50% threshold will be contacted to determine if they wish their names to be included on the ballot for the second year and offered the opportunity to update their nomination materials. Any nominee not be selected two years in a row must be formally nominated again to be reconsidered.

The Membership Chair will receive the nominations and supporting materials and prepare them for distribution with the ballot. Each nominee's membership will be confirmed with NAEA office prior to the preparation of the ballot.

September 16 (specific date set annually): Deadline for submission of completed DF nominations to Membership Chair and Chair.

September 23 (specific date set annually): Deadline for distribution of ballots. The DF Chair works with NAEA staff to prepare and distribute a ballot or ballot link by email. Regular mail ballots will be sent to those DF who are not using email. The NAEA standardized vita and nomination statement for each nominee will be attached to the ballot. The deadline for voting is to be included with electronic and mail ballots.

Sample Ballot Letter:

Subject: ACTION NEEDED: Class of 20__ NAEA Distinguished Fellows Ballot Good Morning: It is time to vote for the Class of 20__ NAEA Distinguished Fellows. We urge you to take the time to vote and exercise your right as an NAEA Distinguished Fellow to select your new colleagues for the class of 20__.

Below is a link to view the ballot and supporting materials for the election of the Class of 20__ NAEA Distinguished Fellows. You may vote for up to five candidates. Up to five candidates receiving votes from more than 50% of the Fellows who vote will be recommended to the NAEA Board of Directors for ratification. If more than five nominees qualify, the five names with the top vote percentages will be submitted to the Board. Those candidates who are not elected will automatically be placed on the nomination list for the Class of 20__.

All ballots are due on or before ____. Results of the election will be forwarded for ratification to the NAEA Board.

In addition, criteria for DF should be include as part of the cover letter.

October 23 (specific date set annually): Deadline for voting. Votes are tallied. The DF Membership Chair works with the DF Chair and with NAEA staff to determine the results of the election.

Up to five candidates receiving votes from a minimum of 50% of the Fellows who vote are recommended to the NAEA Board of Directors for ratification. If more than five nominees qualify, the five names with the top vote percentages will be submitted to the Board. Those candidates who are not elected will be offered a second chance on the nomination list for the next class. The outgoing NAEA Past President is not counted in the five.

October 26 (by two weeks prior to the fall NAEA Board meeting): The Chair submits results of election to the NAEA Board. Names of up to five nominees and their supporting materials are submitted to the NAEA Board of Directors for consideration at the fall board meeting.

After the fall NAEA Board meeting: The NAEA Executive Director notifies the DF Chair and Membership Chair of the actions of the NAEA Board. Newly elected Fellows are notified by the DF Chair and NAEA Executive Director. The Chair and Membership Chair notify the DF membership of the election results.

The Chair will notify nominees that did not meet the required 50% threshold that, with their approval, they will be placed on the ballot for reconsideration during the election the following year.

The Chair and the Membership Chair send a message to all newly-elected Fellows welcoming them and asking each to submit a 100-word professional biographical statement which will be used to induct them as a member of the Class of ____ and to introduce them to their DF colleagues at the annual DF Business Meeting. The Chair will let newly-elected Fellows know of the dates and times of both events as soon as the information is available. The Membership Chair will immediately include the new Fellows on the DF contact and email list.
