

RAEA E-BULLETIN CO-EDITORSHIP

Several years ago the RAEA decided to develop a timely method of communicating with members. At that time the only avenue to communicate was through the NAEA publications. That process meant that a period of three to four months would pass before the news was received by the membership. It was determined that by establishing an e-bulletin information could be disseminated within a few days. Using the NAEA email list the e-bulletin was formed and membership began getting a bimonthly RAEA e-bulletin. This bulletin could bring more detailed information regarding RAEA programming, State and Regional information and could "spotlight" the activities of individual members. Issues of the e-bulletin have been archived on the RAEA page at "arteducators.com" so that back issues can be accessed. Currently issues since September 2015 are there.


