

#### SPOTLIGHT ON MEMBERS

"SYMBIOSIS"

In its most general definition, symbiosis describes a mutually beneficial relationship between two dissimilar and independent entities. Given that each piece we create is the product of a collaborative effort, the choice of *Symbiosis* as the title for this exhibition may seem an obvious one. Indeed, we have two singular artistic visions and two different ways of working in the medium of clay, but we find that these differences nurture, inform, and expand one another to produce a new gestalt. Dan's skill as a potter builds the foundation for our pieces with his wheel-thrown forms. He describes his work as a "blank canvas" which he turns over to Mary for sculptural alterations, surface decoration, and glaze design. However, this partnership goes beyond artisanal construction of the visual to the refinement of concepts, for true art lies not in the finished product, but in ideas. We find that the give-and-take of collaboration stimulates the creative process and yields work that is more than the sum of its parts. Nevertheless, the name *Symbiosis* captures more than our working relationship as artists. It begins with the interaction of artist and materials. Without the potter, the clay has substance without meaning, while the potter needs the clay to give visible artistic concepts. At its most basic level, the clay itself experiences a symbiotic relationship with fire. A raw clay vessel is laden with impurities; it is weak and ephemeral. But those impurities fuel the fire, and as the fire is fed, it purifies the clay, granting it strength and permanence in the process.











The show runs June 14 - July 22 at Harris Arts Center in Calhoun, Georgia. This is our fourth regional gallery show of our sculptural ceramic pieces since May 2015.

The title of the show "Symbiosis" reflects the collaborative nature of our work. I do all the wheel throwing and Mary adds the hand built elements and glazes.







#### **NEWS FROM THE STATES**

Approximately two months ago I was surprised by a representative from the National Teachers Hall of Fame, as one of only five teachers nationwide that would be inducted. The five of us (Michigan, Virginia, Texas, Georgia and Idaho) would spend a week in Washington, D.C. with the NEA, Department of Education, and a meeting with the President.

Three weeks after that we would go to Emporia State University for a week to be a part of many venues, including a rededication of the Fallen Heroes Memorial (Educators who lost their lives on the job) and the formal Induction of the five of us. This was the 25th Induction class, so now there are 125 teachers in the Hall. I am the first teacher to be inducted from Idaho, so this was extra special.

It happened that I also celebrated my 40th year of taking art to the tiny Prairie School, which was another milestone. Please go to the National Teachers Hall of Fame website as there is a livestream of our Induction ceremony.


### VIDABETH BENSEN

They may also be seen at NC State in an exhibit of work of Chatham Artist Guild members. Vidabeth will present a workshop in Screen Printing at the NC Art Teachers Convention in Winston Salem in October.





A few weeks ago, four selections from my **56 Hearts Project** were installed, with the grouping titled "**The Heart of Teaching**" at Duke's Teach House. https://ssri.duke.edu/news/full-house-living-and-learning-together. Teach House is an innovative program housed in a lovely old home where several beginning teachers (Duke Teach House Fellows) live together and mentor one another.

The meaningful art installation models a best practice of teaching through the arts, and is a daily reminder and inspiration for the teachers and visitors to Teach House. It was a sublime honor for my art to be used in this way and a wonderful experience to meet the gifted Teach House Fellows and learn about their work. Several pieces of Durham Public Schools student art work are also exhibited in various places in this beautiful home.

To challenge myself as an artist, I did a painting each day for 56 days leading to my 56th birthday, which had a special meaning for me since I was born in 1956. I dedicated each one to a person, organization, or attribute that inspires me. As an art educator, many of the pieces were related to teaching, and the ideas and techniques were ones I had used often in my own art room.

Dr. Alan Teasley and I worked together to select four paintings that represented the four licensure areas in the Duke Master of Arts in Teaching program. It was a joy to see my own art used to model best practices of teaching through the arts, especially in the caring and creative way that Dr. Teasley imagined and commissioned the Heart of Teaching grouping.

The Being of a teacher is still with me, though I may not be in the classroom anymore, and my hope is that **The Heart of Teaching** will provide ongoing encouragement, connectivity and inspiration.
